I hope you all had an extraordinary and meaningful Christmas full of God's hope, peace, joy and love. What a wonderful month with the Sunday School, Circles and Choir parties, the extraordinary Wildflower Brunch, the Children's Christmas Pageant, the Choral Cantata and many special gatherings for children, youth, men's and women's groups. Worship was extra special and God's people gave to help others in generous and meaningful ways.

The year 2020 will start off with a Spiritual Growth Campaign called "Transformed." It is based on the Bible verse Romans 12:2: "Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind." We will have a series of 7 sermons and 7 Bible Studies on the following areas for "Transformed: How God Changes Us:" spiritual health, physical health, mental health, emotional health, relational health, financial health and your vocational health.

A phenomenal workbook will be made available for those who wish to use one to enhance their experience of "Transformed." It is great for small group study and daily devotionals. It includes memory verses, discovery questions, "putting it into practice," help for your prayer life and "diving deeper."

Transformation is about more than just putting information in your head. It is about living out what God is working in you. The Bible says "Be doers of the Word and not hearers only." (James 1:22)

In other words, to conform is to fit into somebody else's mold; it is to do things the way everybody else does. On the other hand, to transform means to "change the condition, function, nature, character or personality" of something.
