PNC The Pastor Nominating Committee is elected by the congregation (05/02/21)

EP <u>Executive Presbyter</u> — Dr. Roy Martin of our Florida Presbytery will be an always available resource for our PNC.

COM The Committee On Ministry of our presbytery chair Ruling Elder Don Mowatt of Lynn Haven, will be our liaison to the PNC. The COM approves our Ministry Information Form and will meet with and approve our potential pastor to discern a match for our church. Every Presbytery has a COM made up of pastors and laypeople.

MIF The <u>Ministry Information Form gives prospective pastors a glimpse of our church and demographics, and the characteristics and gifts for which we're looking in our next pastor.</u>


PIF The <u>Personal Information Form</u> is completed by pastors open to a new Call, allowing them to share what they feel are their gifts for ministry and what they're praying for in their next church.

CLC The Church Leadership Connection office in Louisville, KY, is a resource for PNC's and pastors open to a new Call. (The CLC computer matches our MIF with PIFs for our PNC to consider.)

Next month I'll share a timeline/process for the PNC from now until the congregational meeting to elect our new pastor. Be in daily prayer about this Calling process and let me or a member of Session or the PNC know if you have any questions.

When you're in town, worship our Lord faithfully with us. When you're on vacation, find a church in which to worship and bring me a copy of your bulletin as I love seeing what's happening in and for our Lord in other parishes. And, as always, call, text or email if you have questions, ideas, concerns, or if I can be of support with you/yours in any way. It's a blessing for Donna and me to be in ministry and mission with you.

The Book of JAMES Commentary by Pastor Francis Chan

True faith produces fruit. A faith without action and without life change is ultimately a dead faith. The book of James speaks to the realities of a living faith in Jesus—the kind of roll-up-your-sleeve and get-your-hands-dirty discipleship that is borne out of an authentic relationship with our risen Lord. James writes to believers who know suffering, who've faced trials, and who ultimately desire a deep relationship with God.

Francis Chan unpacks the dense truth contained in the book of James in front of the iconic backdrop of the west coast city where he lives and teaches and pastors. Francis works through James verse-by-verse, challenging followers of Christ to move beyond a private, intellectual knowledge of God and Word, to a vibrant faith that impacts every square inch of our lives.

We'll prayerfully read and ponder a chapter in James each week at home; come to the fellowship hall on Wednesdays at noon (with our lunch if we'd like), listen to Pastor Chan's "take" on the chapter; and then discuss what the chapter is saying to the church/Christ's disciples in the summer of 2021!
