How a Presbyterian Church Calls A New Pastor

- 1. The congregation elects a Nominating Committee which nominates for congregational election a slate of nominees to serve as the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). (LuAnne Law, Mel McLure Clark, Mary Ann Gibbs, John W. Milton and Andy Tinsley were elected on May 2nd.)
- 2. After election, a member of our presbytery's Committee on Ministry will be assigned to serve as a liaison with our PNC, serving as a resource throughout the process. I served on the Committee on Ministry of Tampa Bay Presbytery; and was a liaison with three churches seeking a new pastor; and my last two churches Called five associate pastors, of which I was involved. So, I will also be a resource for our PNC, as needed.
- 3. The PNC elects a chair (LuAnne Law) and begins work on and completes a <u>Ministry Information Form</u> MIF (Our church's demographics, the qualities for which we're looking in our new pastor, etc.) which will be used for computer matching with pastors who are open to a new Call's Personal Information Forms (Resume: what they feel are their particular gifts for ministry and that for which they're praying in their next Call).
- 4. The Ministry Information Form is approved by our Session and our presbytery's Committee on Ministry, and signed by our Clerk of Session and our Presbytery's COM chair; and then emailed to our denomination's <u>Church Leadership Connection office in Louisville</u>, Kentucky. Potential pastors will be able to see our MIF on a denomination-wide opportunity list.
- 5. The PNC begins to receive PIFs from Louisville, as well as perhaps self-referrals and other suggestions from those who know we're seeking a new pastor.
- 6. The PNC makes contact with pastors with whom they'd like to learn more and perhaps enter into conversation (emails, phone calls, facetimes, interviews, receiving dvds of sermons, calling references, perhaps a questionnaire, etc.). As there are two Session members on the PNC, our Session will be kept up-to-date as to where the PNC is in their process. The PNC will also keep our congregation apprised as to where the process is (newsletter, minutes for mission, etc.). Names of prospective pastors are <u>never</u> discussed.
- At some point in the journey, the PNC will invite a top candidate or candidates (and spouse if applicable) to preach in a nearby "neutral" pulpit and visit our church campus and community, with face-to-face interview(s).

- 8. At some point, the PNC will vote to extend a Call to a pastor with agreed upon Terms of Call. (Salary, professional expenses, one-half of self employment tax, PCUSA Board of Pensions medical and Pensions dues, etc.)
- 9. If they accept, the potential pastor will meet with our presbytery's Committee on Ministry, which also has to approve.
- 10. If the way be clear with number nine, the PNC informs our Session of the need to call/advertise a Congregational Meeting for the PNC to share why they feel this is the person God is Calling to our church, and for the congregation to vote on the candidate and the terms of Call.
- 11. If the way be clear with number ten, a timeline is established for the new pastor/family (if applicable) to move to Marianna and begin their fruitful and faithful ministries in our church, community and presbytery.
- 12. The PNC is thanked and often <u>wisely</u> continues to meet with the new pastor on some type of regular basis for a time for support, to answer questions, provide feedback, etc. to make for a smooth beginning and transition.

Let's all keep our PNC in our prayers as they are now at step five, in record time! It's a blessing for me to work with these five very dedicated disciples and Ruling Elder, Don Mowat (Committee on Ministry of the Presbytery of Florida) of our Lynn Haven Presbyterian Church, and to serve as your interim pastor.

PRESBYTERIAN QUESTIONS, PRESBYTERIAN ANSWERS

Q 86. What are the main features of the Presbyterian form of church government?

There are three basic forms of government found among churches. A hierarchical or episcopal form is marked by power lodged in the office of bishop. The bishop exercises authority over churches from that office. This form of government is found in the Roman Catholic Church, Episcopal churches, and Methodist churches.

The second type of church government is the congregational form. Here, each church acts autonomously and independently of other groups. In denominations with congregational forms of government, churches may join together in a federation or seek guidance from a larger grouping of churches. But ultimate decision making rests in the local congregation. The United Church of Christ and various Congregational denominations, as well as Baptist churches, are examples of the congregational form of church government.

The Presbyterian form of government is representational. Local congregations elect a group of Elders called a session for oversight. Representatives of sessions and the clergy of churches in a particular geographical area form a presbytery. Presbyteries in a region comprise a synod. All the synods of a wide area form the General Assembly. This is a "presbyterian" form of polity (church government) because presbyteries are the governing units that exercise direct authority over churches.

Presbyterian policy is grounded in principles that emphasize the unity of the church; its government by "presbyters," traditionally called ruling and teaching elders; and the commitment to governing bodies made up of presbyters meeting together in graduated units to the General Assembly level. Presbyters who govern are to seek the will of Christ and to decide by vote, after discussion and through majority rule. The decisions of lower governing bodies can be reviewed by higher bodies. Presbyters are ordained only through a governing body and exercise shared power in governing the church through governing bodies. The church's Constitution is administered through the governing bodies, which maintain a mutuality of relationships among the various church structures. Presbyterians believe this governing system is established in accord with Scripture and exists to further good order in the church while seeking to be open to God's ongoing work in the church and in human history.


SEWING WITH LOVE continues meeting on Wednesdays at 10:00 am in the church office and there is room for more, so please come and bring a friend if you'd like.
