Just these lines.....this fall month.....to share with you the ordination questions from our Presbyterian <u>Book of Order</u> which ruling elders and teaching elders (pastors) answer when we are "set apart" for service and ministry in our Lord's church —

- A. Do you trust in Jesus Christ your Savior, acknowledge him Lord of all and Head of the church, and through him believe in one God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?
- B. Do you accept the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be, by the Holy Spirit, the unique and authoritative witness to Jesus Christ in the Church universal, and God's Word to you?
- C. Do you sincerely receive and adopt the essential tenets of the Reformed faith as expressed in the confessions of our church as authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do, and will you be instructed and led by those confessions as you lead the people of God?
- D. Will you fulfill your ministry in obedience to Jesus Christ, under the authority of Scripture, and be continually guided by our confessions?
- E. Will you be governed by our church's polity, and will you abide by its discipline? Will you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, working with them, subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit?
- F. Will you in your own life seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love your neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world?
  - G. Do you promise to further the peace, unity, and purity of the church?
  - H. Will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love?
- I. (1) (For ruling elder) Will you be a faithful ruling elder, watching over the people, providing for their worship, nurture, and service? Will you share in government and discipline, serving in councils of the church, and in your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?
- (2) (For minister of the Word and Sacrament) Will you be a faithful minister of the Word and Sacrament, proclaiming the good news in Word and Sacrament, teaching faith and caring for people? Will you be active in government and discipline, serving in the councils of the church; and in your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

Let's pray for our 2021 Nominating Committee as they soon will nominate to our congregation four members to serve as Elders on our Session, Class of 2024, and for our Pastor Nominating Committee as it will some Sunday nominate our church's next pastor.


SEWING/CRAFT GROUP

#### PRESBYTERIAN QUESTIONS,

#### PRESBYTERIAN ANSWERS

#### "What are elders and what do they do?"

Traditionally the term "elder" in Presbyterian churches refers either to a "teaching elder" — the minister of Word and Sacrament — or to a "ruling elder," who is a layperson ordained to this office in a local congregation.

"Elder" is a term stretching back to Old Testament times, when the people of Israel were governed by elders (Ex.3:16; 1 Sam. 8:4). In the New Testament, persons with special gifts shared in governing and ministries in local churches (Acts 15:4; Titus 1:5). The word "elder" is an English translation of the Greek term *presbyteros* found in the New Testament. So, a "presbyterian" church is governed by elders.

Ruling elders are elected by the congregation and have responsibilities for leadership, government, and discipline in local churches and in other governing bodies, such as presbyteries, synods, and the General Assembly, to which they are elected as commissioners. In these bodies, ruling elders participate and vote in parity with teaching elders. Collectively, the body of ruling elders who exercise oversight over local congregations is called the session.

The duties of the elder are to strengthen and nurture Christian faith in congregations and to exercise spiritual oversight over the life and work

of the church. Particularly they work with the pastor for the ordering of public worship and for equipping the congregation for ministries to the world. Special circumstances may lead to elders being able to perform ministerial functions as authorized by a presbytery.

Ruling elders have exemplary duties and responsibilities by virtue of their ordination and role in the life of the church. They are to lead the congregation in enacting the law of love as they support the mission and ministry of the church through its worship, education, and service.

Further specific duties of the session are enumerated in different Presbyterian denominations. The pastor of a church serves as the moderator of the session. Many Presbyterian churches also have deacons (ordained) and trustees (nonordained) to carry out their distinctive functions. In some churches, elders also assume the duties of deacons and/or trustees.

## 2021 Nominating Committee Seeks Spiritual Leaders for our Church Elders — Session Class of 2024

Each fall, our church's Nominating Committee (elected by the congregation in January) prayerfully discerns the Holy Spirit's direction in nominating for election four members to our congregation to serve a three-year term on our session as well as on our permanent committees.

### G-2.03 RULING ELDERS: THE MINISTRY OF DISCERNMENT AND GOVERNANCE G-2.0301 Ruling Elder Defined

As there were in Old Testament times elders for the government of the people, so the New Testament church provided persons with particular gifts to share in discernment of God's Spirit and governance of God's people. Accordingly, congregations should elect persons of wisdom and maturity of faith, having demonstrated skills in leadership and being compassionate in spirit. Ruling elders are so named not because they "lord it over" the congregation (Matt. 20:25) but because they are chosen by the congregation to discern and measure its fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life. Ruling elders, together with ministers of the Word and Sacrament, exercise leadership, government, spiritual discernment, and discipline and have responsibilities for the life of a congregation as the whole church, including ecumenical relationships. When elected by the congregation, they shall serve faithfully as members of the session. When elected as commissioners to higher councils, ruling elders participate and vote with the same authority as ministers of the Word and Sacrament, and they are eligible for any office. (Presbyterian Church USA Book of Order)

As spiritual and pastoral leaders, potential elders are expected to currently be very faithful in weekly worship, (in person, Facebook or radio) currently involved in some educational or service aspect of our church; and faithful in sharing a portion of their time, spiritual gifts and financial resources for our church's growing ministry and mission. Please recommend members whom you would like for this year's Nominating Committee to consider by prayerfully printing and placing this form in an envelope and putting it an offering plate or mailing it to the church by Sunday, October 10.
