JANUARY SESSION NOTES

- 1. Opened (Bill Stevens) and closed (Donna Moore) the meeting with prayer.
- 2. Sustained the examination of Lou Roberts, Elder Elect.
- 3. Received reports from the Church Treasurer, the Property and Operations Committee and the Pastor Nominating Committee. Received the end 2021 Annual Statistical Report.
- Approved sending a generous donation to the First Presbyterian Church of Mayfield, KY. (Campus facilities were leveled in recent tornadoes.)
- Approved returning to regular communion in March (serving bread and juice in the pews) keeping the option of what we've been doing since March, 2020, available.
- 6. Discussed some "True/False" statements about our Presbyterian <u>Book</u> of <u>Order</u>. (Take the attached quiz; and we'll tell you the answers in March.)
- 7. Heard that a job description for a summer 2022 intern (to serve primarily with children, youth and young adults and their families) is forthcoming through the Christian Education Committee.
- 8. Heard that we will kick off Lent with an Ash Wednesday luncheon and short service on March 2.
- 9. Pastor Raymond led a short review on the responsibilities of Ruling Elders and how we can have a great Session this year. "Our church manual was prepared with much prayer and consideration and needs to be followed. Committees need to meet on some type of regular basis in this post-Michael and we pray post-COVID return to normality!

Presbyterian <u>Book of Order</u> True or False

- 1. The teaching Elder and Ruling Elders are the head of a Presbyterian church.
- 2. Not all Presbyterian churches have Elders.
- 3. The word "Presbyterian" is first seen in the Old Testament presbyterous and means "deacon".
- 4. No quorums are needed for session or congregational meetings.
- 5. Our presbytery is named The Panhandle with the office located in Panama City.
- 6. Our national denominational office is in Lexington, KY, and is painted blue because the multi-floor building was donated to our church by a group of University of Kentucky alum.
- 7. The Nominating committee is elected each year by the various committees of our church.
- 8. Elders are elected by the Session.
- 9. Pastors are elected by the Session.
- 10. The pastor and three Elders can call a Congregational Meeting on any given Sunday to take place at the end of the worship service.
- 11. Any issue on members' minds can be discussed and voted on at Congregational Meetings.
- 12. Pastors can approve upcoming baptisms and weddings with no session concurrence.
- 13. Session meetings are to be opened and closed by reading poetry.
- 14. The annual church budget is approved at a congregational meeting each January.
- 15. The Session has the authority to amend the Call (salary, benefits) of the Pastor.
- 16. The presbytery is not involved in the Calling of a new pastor in a local church.
- 17. The worship committee has the final say as to what scriptures are read and what hymns are sung in the Sunday worship service.
- 18. Any changes in the salaries of non-ordained staff have to be approved by the congregation.
- 19. In the Presbyterian Church USA, completion of seminary guarantees a student being ordained and appointed to a church.
- 20. The purchased or sale of property and/or borrowing funds can be approved by the Session.
- 21. Presbytery's councils and committees are made up of pastors within the presbytery.
- 22. The presbytery's executive is appointed by the General Assembly.
- 23. Our synod (Flint/Suwanee) is made up of all of the PCUSA churches in Georgia and Florida.
- 24. When the General Assembly meets every other year, in Lexington, the commissioners are 1/3 Teaching Elders (pastors) 1/3 Ruling Elders (lay) and 1/3 Deacons.



PRESBYTERIAN QUESTIONS, PRESBYTERIAN ANSWERS

Why do Presbyterians baptize babies?

Presbyterians, like many other Protestants and also Roman Catholics, practice infant baptism. Infants are presented by their parents, in a church service, to receive the sacrament of baptism. At that time, parents make vows, as does the congregation.

We baptize babies because we believe our children are included in God's covenant of grace with Christian believers. In the Old Testament, the sign of God's covenant relationship with the people of Israel was circumcision (Gen. 17:11). The New Testament church saw baptism as the new sign of God's covenant with the church, the new people of God (Col. 2:11-15). Jesus Christ is God's "new covenant" (Luke 22:20; 1 Cor. 11:25). In Him, all the promises of God find their "Yes" (2 Cor. 1:20). Baptism is a sign of the believer's incorporation into Christ as we are adopted into the family of God.

We also believe that just as in the Old Testament the sign of God's covenant was given to those of faith and their children, so also now the benefits of Jesus Christ as God's new covenant of grace are extended to believers and their children as well (Acts

2:39). In the baptism of infants we recognize this covenant and celebrate the entry of our children into the church. Infant baptism is the sign and seal of God's promises in Jesus Christ to our children.

Traditionally, those baptized as infants are "confirmed" in their faith when they reach an "age of accountability." At that point, young persons affirm the vows taken on their behalf by their parents when they were baptized. In baptism, parents promise to raise their child by teaching faith. The congregation promises to support, nurture, and provide opportunities for the child to grow in faith.

Infant baptism is not a "guarantee" of salvation. But it is a wonderful sign of God's electing love. The helpless child is drawn into the family of God, just as all of us — as sinners — are saved by God's grace "while we (are) weak" and unable to save ourselves (Rom. 5:6).
