### PRESBYTERIAN QUESTIONS, PRESBYTERIAN ANSWERS

### Why don't Presbyterian churches have altars?

When you walk into many churches and look to the front you see an altar. In Roman Catholic churches this is a central focus, since in the Mass when the Eucharist is observed the eucharistic elements, the bread and the wine, are placed on the altar, and the priest recites the liturgy in which the elements become the body and blood of Jesus Christ. In the Mass, Jesus Christ is resacrificed for the sins of the world.

Presbyterian churches have a Communion table instead of an altar. We believe that the sacrifice of Jesus Christ has been offered once and for all on the cross (Heb. 7:27; 9:26). In the Lord's Supper, or Communion, we remember that sacrifice, are nourished by it, and receive the benefits of Christ's death for us by faith through the power of the Holy Spirit. We do not believe that the bread and wine "become" the body and blood of Christ in any literal or physical way. The elements are the means by which the gospel message of Jesus Christ comes to us and is received by believers in the context of the Christian community.

So Presbyterian churches have Communion tables instead of altars. An altar is where a sacrifice is offered. We believe that the sacrifice of Christ has already been definitively offered in his death on the

Cross. So now we remember that death, appropriate what Christ has done for us, and commit ourselves to Christ's service as we eat and drink together in the sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

We do this from the Communion table, which should be placed on the level of the congregation rather than elevated above the people's level as an altar would be. We receive the Communion elements from the Lord's Table as the common elements of life, which reminds us that Jesus Christ became a human, like us, to bring the salvation that God gives to human sinners.

When elders distribute the Communion elements to the congregation, we are reminded that we receive Jesus Christ from our neighbor and that we communicate Jesus Christ to our neighbors. The Lord's Supper celebrates what God has done in Christ. We do not try to repeat this act from an altar, but rather to commemorate it and receive the benefits of Christ for our lives.




There are a few brochures on the table between the fellowship hall and the sanctuary. The brochure provides some information regarding the camps available this summer and also says that scholarships are available.




