PRESBYTERIAN QUESTIONS, PRESBYTERIAN ANSWERS

What is the "priesthood of all believers"?

The "priesthood of all believers" is a phrase associated with Martin Luther in the sixteenth century, and is often related to his concern that all Christians can act in "priestly" ways — by praying to God directly, and not having to go through a church's "priest" — and that all believers may teach the Christian faith to others on the basis of their own reading of the Scriptures. Linked with Luther's view that we are justified by faith alone ("justification by faith"), the priesthood of all believers became a liberating feature of the Protestant Reformation, since it meant that individual believers had great freedom and were not forced to go to God through the church's priests, and could read and interpret the Bible for themselves.

Presbyterian theology recognizes the truth of Luther's perspectives. We go on, however, to see also that the church itself as the covenant community of God is a "chosen race, a royal priesthood" (I Pet. 2:9; Rev. 1:6; 5:10). We are made "priests" through Jesus Christ, who is the only true priest (Heb. 3:1) and who has called us into our ministries through the new covenant he has established (I Cor. 11:25).

This means that the church has a calling, or vocation, to be "priests" in that we have a corporate responsibility and a privilege as God's believing, covenant people. Our "priesthood" is to offer Jesus Christ to the world, offer ourselves as "a living sacrifice" (Rom. 12:1), and pray to God on behalf of our sisters and brothers in Christ as well as on behalf of the whole world (James 5:16). Individual congregations act as a microcosm of the whole church and carry out the mission and ministries of the church on behalf of God and God's kingdom in the person of Jesus Christ. To participate in the church is to have a "priestly" ministry to others and for others. Those ordained by the church as "ministers of the Word" carry out certain ministerial functions. But all members of the covenant community in the church as the people of God have our ministries to carry out as well. We all share in the corporate "priesthood of all believers."




COOKBOOKS




June Session Notes



A MESSAGE FROM OUR MISSIONARIES IN NIGER

Much has gone on with our family, in addition to all the changes in the world since my visit in 2016. That was a wonderful visit for me to meet college and high school students in addition to everyone at the church. And the area is paradise for someone with interests in geology like me. Thanks to all for that wonderful visit.

John and Joseph, who were all in high school. Sons Jason and Michael were attending a school in Orlando and working part-time there. Salome and Selina graduated virtually in 2020 with all the pandemic issues, and Jodi and the kids returned to the US on the last Covid-related repatriation flight back to the US from West Africa. I remained behind until September of 2020 when flights opened up again, and joined the family in Mission Haven next to Columbia Seminary in Decatur GA right outside of Atlanta. Michael and Jason also returned to be living with the family there. Salome went to the American University in Greece for summer and Fall sessions, but has returned to the US again. John and Joseph just finished their junior year at Decatur High and will graduate from there next year. All the kids are working part-time jobs which are easy to come by, and without benefits, but all are doing well.

While Jodi was in Niamey, she helped establish the Nursing School for the new University of the Eglise Evangelique de la Republique du Niger (EERN) – the church with whom we work. I began working with the church on low-cost water, sanitation and hygiene programmes. After our return to the US, we made the decision that Jodi would remain behind so that John and Joseph would not have to change schools again, and they would be able to take advantage of all the many programmes available that are so helpful for them that they could not have here in Niger. So in remaining behind, Jodi has "retired" from PC(USA) and I have signed up for another 3 year term based in Niger. I returned to Niamey in June of 2021 to continue working with the WASH work of the church. I still am connected to South Sudan work, but it has been since November 2019 before the pandemic that I have been there. I hope to be able to travel there next month.

Back here in Niger, we as ex-pats are not allowed to leave the capital city by road due to some security issues in the area. However, I can fly to the Maradi Region of Niger and am able to work on rural WASH issues from there. So we are building the work of the Church in water sanitation and hygiene in the urban settings in Niamey, and in the rural settings around Maradi.

Please let me know if you have been receiving our newsletters. They are available online, but you should be getting hardcopies mailed to the church.

Please greet everyone at 1st Pres Marianna for me. I look forward to hearing how things are there at 1st Pres.
