Just these lines.....this new month.....to share with you part of a very affirming article that I recently read, written by ordained Presbyterian Commissioned Ruling Elder, Will Wiles, who lives and serves several small churches in northeastern Oklahoma (with a few edits by me).

"All My Reasons for Choosing to Be and Remain

A Faithful and Enthusiastic Member and Lay Pastor of a PCUSA Congregation

- 1. We are a denomination that encourages our members to study the Bible for ourselves and then discuss it with other members of our faith communities, to discern its meanings for our lives in the guidance of the Holy Spirit.
- 2. We are a denomination that affirms the Reformation tenet of the "priesthood of all believers." This affirmation is most visible in our practice of passing the Communion trays from person to person on each row from our peers, rather than receiving Communion from a priest or minister.
- 3. We are a denomination that publicly and corporately confesses our individual and corporate sin as a part of our worship service.
- 4. We are a denomination that welcomes <u>all</u> of God's children to positions of authority and leadership, at all denominational levels, as they are Called and elected (not appointed).
- 5. We are a denomination in which ordained elders and ordained clergy share <u>equally</u> in providing pastoral services to congregations as well as in church governance from the session of the local church to the presbytery, the synod, through the highest judicatory levels of our denomination (the General Assembly).
- 6. We are a denomination that cares deeply about our youth & children, going so far as to give youth a place at the table of our national meetings.
- 7. We are a denomination that seeks to address social injustices, even when it is not always popular to do so.
- 8. We are a denomination with a missional concern for sharing the Gospel at home and all around the world.
- 9. We are a denomination that believes the connectedness of our congregations is symbolic of the Body of Christ where everyone is included. This is demonstrated by how our presbyteries structure their leadership. We make sure that there are equal numbers of elders and clergy, that those leaders are diverse (We have a specific committee to maintain balance between gender, race, age, clergy and non-clergy) and that committees involve people from throughout the whole presbytery.

- 10. We are a denomination with an educated and trained clergy. Our ordained ministers are required to have a minimum Master of Divinity degree (after a Bachelor's degree) and to pass ordination examinations on Bible content, Presbyterian polity, Hebrew and Greek, reformed theology, and our two sacraments.
- 11. We believe that God alone is the Lord of our conscience and that Christ alone is the head of our church.

While other denominations can claim some of these characteristics, I know of no other denomination, mainline or otherwise, which can lay claim to <u>all</u> of them. I share them as an encouragement to my fellow Presbyterians. I believe we can lay claim to our history, the shared theology on which our churches are built and our collective worship practices and mission growth as a way of <u>celebrating</u> what we are doing right, even though we have our challenges.

We have a strong shared foundation; and the presence of differences under our big tent is a powerful witness to how our denomination welcomes all of God's people into our membership. Our strength lies in our unity in diversity within the Body of Christ. Let's use our connectedness in a manner that fosters the growth of our larger Christian community — all churches.

PRESBYTERIAN QUESTIONS, PRESBYTERIAN ANSWERS

CAN I LOSE MY SALVATION?

Presbyterians believe in the "perseverance of the saints." This is a theological understanding of salvation to indicate that once we are saved, God continues to hold us in faith so our salvation will not be lost. Sometimes this is called "eternal security," meaning that our lives of faith in Jesus Christ are held secure by God's power throughout our lives, into eternity.

We believe this on the basis of God's faithfulness. God is trustworthy, and the promises God makes, God keeps. The apostle Paul said, "I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ" (Phil. 1:6). God, who gives us the gift of salvation as an act of free grace, will continue to hold us in that salvation until the "day of Jesus Christ" — forever, Jesus indicated the same when he said, "I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand" (John 10:28; cf. 10:29). If we are held in God's hands, we will not slip through God's fingers!

In the Methodist and various Baptist traditions, there is belief in "backsliding." This is the view that a Christian can lose salvation. Due to sin, the salvation once received may be lost. Our Presbyterian theology, however, affirms that because of God's unchangeable love and covenant faithfulness in Jesus Christ, God gives the gift of perseverance. We are held in salvation by God's power, not our own. God's Spirit seals us for the "day of redemption" (Eph. 4:30). may be times and experiences in our lives where we sin and sin grievously. There may be long periods where it appears that we have drifted away or "lost" our salvation in If someone who previously con-Christ. fessed faith in Christ comes to denounce Christ, it is a sign that the profession of faith was not genuine in the first place. But we do not "backslide" to the point of losing our salvation. When our confession of Christ is genuine and we are united to Christ through faith, God's Holy Spirit abides in us so that we never totally or finally fall away from God's grace. "Perseverance" does not give us a license to live however we please, without regard for God. Instead, it is a source of praise to the God who has graciously called us into salvation, who will continue to hold us in Christ throughout our whole lives and bring us finally to glorification in heaven.


Our Presbytery Of Florida Needs Commissioned Ruling Elders


